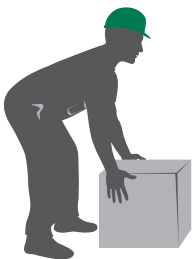

Aguascalientes is the capital of the state of Aguascalientes and is its most populous city, with a metropolitan population of 1 million.

It is located in North-Central Mexico. It is part of the macroregion of Bajío, which is among the **safest** and **most prosperous regions** in Mexico.

Aguascalientes is notable for its significant population of Japanese, Korean, and German residents.
